

SCHOLARSHIP

One of the ABWC's main objectives is to provide scholarships for high school graduates going to college. The committee is looking forward to interviewing students residing in Apollo Beach (33572) and/or are zoned to attend East or Lennard High School.

The scholarship application and criteria have been placed on our website:

<http://www.apollobeachwomansclub.com/scholarship-info.html>. We hope members will become familiar with the criteria so you can promote the scholarship program with your family, friends and acquaintances.

The scholarship amounts are \$700 for Hillsborough Community College (two year degree) and \$1,500 for a four year accredited Florida college or university. The money may be used to cover tuition, books, and fees.

If students attend East Bay or Lennard High School, applications are due on February 19 to the Guidance Counselor at the high school. Other students meeting the residency requirements will mail the applications to Sharon Vasquez by February 19 to 870 Symphony Isles Blvd., Apollo Beach 33572.

The committee will be going to Lennard and East Bay High Schools in March to interview students. Students who meet qualifications and are selected to receive scholarships will be recognized at the May 12 luncheon along with their parents.

Several students have kept in touch and want to thank the ABWC women for granting them a scholarship in May, 2020. **Rosalba Neri** is working on nursing prerequisites with a minor in Nutrition at **University of South Florida**. She made excellent grades while working part time. **Daniela Dominguez** made As in all her classes at **Hillsborough Community College**.

As you know fundraising has been extremely difficult this year. A few of our members have been very generous in donating money to the Scholarship Fund. 




Screenshot: December Zoom Book Club meeting to discuss Britt Marie Was Here by Fredrik Backman.






